Poor Children's tears and pain touched her deeply and she became their mother. On 4th July 2016, we commemorate the 44th death anniversary of this great visionary.

As young missionary she came to India and worked in the sprawling city of Mumbai. In the aftermath of Indian independence, poverty and communal hatred spread its wings in and around the city. Destitute mothers and abandoned babies filled the streets. Mother Anna Huberta reached out to them with Christ like compassion. She spent the nights in prayer and day in service. Seeing this, some girls came to help Mother and they became the first Helpers of Mary. Today we are the heirs to the rich charisma left behind by Mother Anna Huberta. We can see the hand of God who called mother to love the unloved. 75 years since then, Marys are unstoppable, like the seed which became a tree our institute grew and stretched out its branches.

Wonders at Mandyi Mission

Since 1991, Helpers of Mary is working in Mandvi mission for the upliftment of tribal community through education, empowering women, and income generation projects along with MSFS Fathers. Being a politically and communally sensitive area the sisters faced many challenges, difficulties and even risked their life during the course of last 24 years. One of perennial problems that we faced was the issue of the land. We lived and worked on a tribal land that was owned by Mr. Dilip. He kept threatening us to vacate the land or give lump sum money. We had almost decided to pull out of Mandvi. Having worked for many years, and still serving 1500 women, it was really a tuff decision. However there was a dramatic turn of events. We were told by the collectorate that after paying the tax as per the government valuation, we can convert the tribal land into general land and we could actually own the land. The government was also aware of the yeomen services the sisters over the years had rendered to the villages of Mandvi. The General Council decided to procure the land. But little we realised that it will bring such stress and trouble.

The road ahead isn't easy neither impossible. We have to strive, as Bhagavad Gita states "Thy right is to work only, but never to its fruits". Sr. Amrita and myself took up the task of getting this land. We met Collector of Nanded and with his permission we regularized 16 Guntas of land after paying the necessary tax. Government and other wellwishers of the sisters forced Mr. Dilip to give it as gift for the sisters. When the stage was set for the registration of the property, we realised that Mr. Dilip killed his wife and was in prison. The only way forward was to get him out on bail and he in turn signs the papers. It took 24 days of prayer, hardwork, perseverance and travel. Being a murder case, many told that it will be difficult. Fathers from Adilabad assisted us and through local police & lawyer, we met him in Jail. Upon seeing us Mr. Dilip wept bitterly, for the past 11 months no one came to visit him. He said "I am a sinner, and I have realized my mistakes; take me out from here and I am ready to sign any papers". It was a very painful moment. After completing all the formalities, he was released on bail on 24th May and on the same evening we registered the land in the name of Mukhta Jivan society. His mother, sister-in-law and others were also present in the office to sign the documents as well as to witness this. He was under trial but now free to move around. A new beginning for him. For Divya Jyothi Mandvi too, it heralded a new beginning. It was truly a noble gesture in this year of mercy to show a glimpse of God's mercy and pardon to Dilip. We are truly grateful to Sr. Stella our Superior General, sisters of Mandvi, Generalate and all the others whose prayerful support was vital towards this intention.
