Movements to cheer up

When women are empowered, their families are empowered. Keeping this in mind we, the Sisters of Snehagiri Community render our service mainly for the development of tribals, especially women and children. This year we have formed a Federation of 35 Self Help Groups (SHGs). They meet every three months at the Centre to plan, evaluate and organize activities. These women earn their living through Agricultural means. This year we are focused in assisting them to march towards development through farming. The geographical and climatic conditions permit them to have seasonal crop like paddy, which is the only source of livelihood throughout the year. Otherwise these women are jobless, while the men migrate to various places to earn their livelihood. Our Centre makes constant efforts to get Government Schemes and Benefits which otherwise never reach them.

This monsoon through our constant attempt we have succeeded to get seeds of Paddy and Tur Dal from Krushi (agriculture) Department of Dhanu and Talasari Taluka. It was a moments of cheer and gladness when 100 women from the 20 SHG groups received these seeds for cultivation. Their faces were bright and hopeful while they walked group by group into our campus to collect them. The persistence and hard work of the Sisters together with these women were appreciated very much. We also assisted them to get their relevant documents for securing a Ration Card

for these families. Through our regular meetings and family visits we made them aware of their Basic Rights.

An awareness program on domestic violence for women living in the surrounding slums at Andheri was held on the 30th August, 2016 in Kripa Academy Centre for Skills. The resource persons were Lawyers and Social workers from Majlis Centre for Women Domestic Violence. They explained on topic of domestic violence which is a burning issue of the present time. Legal awareness will affirm women to claim for their rights.



239 women benefited from these awareness sessions. Most of them were unaware of laws on violence against women and how to exercise these legal rights. The program was made interesting with multi-media presentations which included a documentary Film on Domestic Violence Act, the right to education and free Legal Aid etc.

This program has definitely been an eye-opener and has encouraged and motivated women to stand up for their Rights. Inspired by this talk women came forward to get guidance from the advocates for their problems faced in their families and at workplaces. As there were many cases to deal with, we decided to begin free legal counseling at Shraddha Community Centre –Andheri. The advocates of Majlis Centre agreed to collaborate with us to provide service twice in a month and give free legal counseling to the affected victims.
