She explained how to apply for it and who is eligible for these different schemes. Fr. William, the Parish Priest spoke on the strength of women when they are united in a group. To enable them to create



a life for themselves and their children following and ending a cycle of poverty to some extent, we motivated them to begin income generation programs. Now a group of widows will start income generation through candle making. It is very necessary to understand their conditions and enable them to live a life that they want.

Here are some ideas to get started, avoiding use of plastic, segregation of garbage, have your own trash and compost system, use reusable container for leftovers, cut down on plastic by carrying your own water bottle, preferably reusable one made of aluminum rather than plastic, opt to wrap gifts in a reusable bag instead of wrapping paper, use of flower pots instead of buying flowers, change light bulbs to eco-friendly types, turn off the lights when not in use, use of cloth bags, collect rain water and store it for future use, rather than allowing it to run off. We believe that our tangible actions, even small ones, do make a difference.

#### **God of Wonder**

On December 16, 2019 Miss Karuna received the good news that District Judge granted her the bail and she could go home and unite with her family. She was a under trial, accused for murdering her brother and has been in prison for three years. I was following this case, checked with the parents about the bail bond and other formalities and also met the advocate for the verification of the bail bond documents. It took almost a month to get the two surety and for verifying various documents. Along with me Karuna's parents, who are illiterate, went to police station and Land Revenue Office to clear the paper of the sureties. On January 17, 2020 Karuna's parents were very peaceful and happy that they would take their daughter home. I accompanied them to the jail and Karuna was released from the Prison in the evening. Mrs. Munni Devi, mother of Karuna said "God works wonder, for three years I have been waiting to get my daughter home and my trust in God made me go on". She knew that her daughter is innocent in this case. She believes that in a few months the case will be closed after the necessary investigation. Those who seek for justice, God will-grant justice!



# **Voluntary Service**

My name is Dr. Hans-Martin Hauff. I am a retired doctor for Children and Youths. My wife, Patricia Duncan-Hauff, is a former English teacher and teacher trainer. We live in Gundelfingen , Germany. We are members of "Indienhilfe-Wasser ist Leben", which has been supporting the SHM for 25 years. We had been considering for a while offering active voluntary help. In 2019 we contacted the Generalate in Andheri in order to find out in which way we could offer our efficient services. We flew on the 30th of January 2020 to Mumbai with a bag full of teaching ideas and methods combining English and Medical Knowledge.

We are here in Shraddha Vihar, where there is the Generalate of the SHM. Our task is teaching English to 1st year Postulants, English lessons and new born baby care to Paramedical students, teaching action songs and rhymes embedded in small stories to the little children in the slum-



nursery school and giving a talk about health and hygiene to the girls in Balbhavan. From the very 1st day we felt warm welcome and integrated by the sisters, paramedical students, senior citizens and children. In the meantime we have a busy daily teaching routine and also supported the Sisters in editing the articles and reports.

Our room is in the children's tract Bal Bhavan (children's home). Going in and out we meet many children at all time of the day. We receive their friendliness and affection and can observe their joy and ambition coping with all their activities and studies. We see the love of the Sisters working with them in all the different fields like praying, singing, dancing, playing, serving the meals, checking their homework, project works and their daily hygiene. The Sisters are of course 24 hours a day with them and give them all their support if needed.

Everywhere we can observe the loving and efficient activities of all the Sisters in all their different places and fields of work in Shraddha Vihar. To give an example of our personal experience we want to mention; Sr. Cecilia who helped us in finding the proper approach to teach the paramedics, Sr. Martha and Sr. Jaivanti who accompanied us with the postulants, Sr. Chaya who walked with us through parts of the slums and introduced us to members of her women's groups. And with many other Sisters whose names are not mentioned we had our daily contacts and often moving conversations. All the Sisters are bound together in their deep faith, daily prayers, meditation and so, they are able to cope with daily challenges.

A very conspicuous, well planned building is the new Bal Bhavan. Everybody and particularly the children will be pleased to move into their new home from the temporary quarters. Sometimes we did our "homework" in the open air near the Little Paradise". We were invited for a cup of tea by Sr. Karuna and found out what a good, caring and peaceful place it is for the elderly Sisters who had worked hard all of their lives and now are themselves in need of care. We could visited the home for elderly people (Jivan Asha) with 60 seniors and feel the caring and supporting spirit of the sisters and supporting staff. We looked round the hospital with a maternity room, a delivery room, a department with sonography and consulting rooms for outpatients. We were invited to meet a pediatric colleague and had a good and informative talk with him.

On Sunday 2nd February we were privileged to attend and celebrate the Golden Jubilee of 10 Sisters, beginning with Holy Mass and ending with various dancing activities. The colourful performances were created and practiced by all the different groups of girls assisted by the Sisters with choreography and costumes. What a wonderful sight and feeling! Vivid colours, shining happiness and radiation of joy. We were able to feel particularly in these moments the dedication and spirit of the SHM of loving, caring and educating the countless children and young women to give them a better future.

Our pupils are very attentive, diligent and grateful. Day by day we experienced the hospitality and the religious fulfillment of the Sisters. When we imparted our knowledge and experience as an English teacher and as a children's doctor we received an abundance of kindness, warmth, acknowledgment and smiling faces. We appreciate this precious gift and will certainly treasure it when we return to Gundelfingen, Germany!
